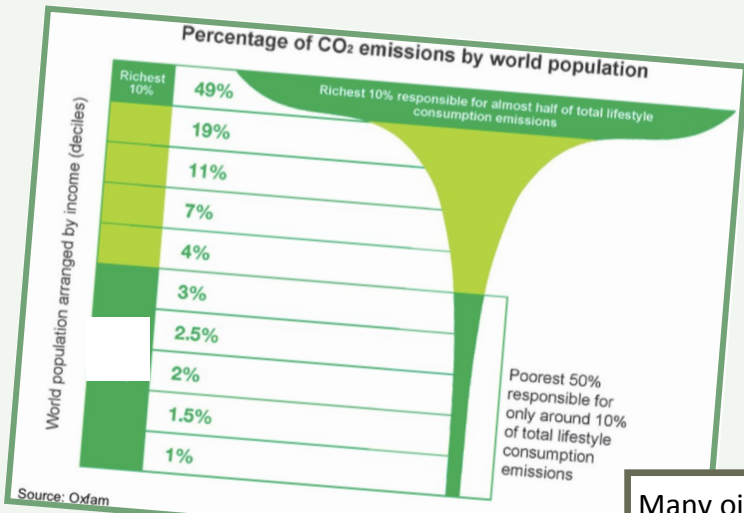


Who to Blame: Corporate Greed and Climate Change Denial

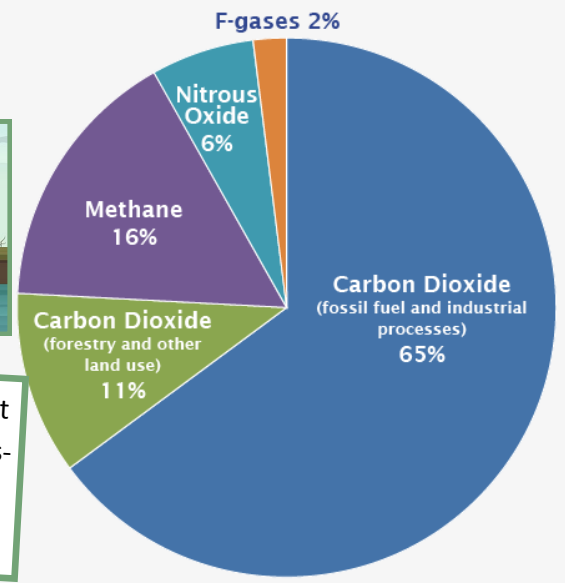


Over **70%** of global emissions are caused by the **same 100 companies**.

Many oil companies, politicians, and large corporations often urge people to "do their part" to fight climate change. This puts the responsibility on individuals to save the environment rather than where it belongs — on them.

We need to pivot blame towards the corporations, politicians, and government organizations who bear responsibility for much of today's climate emergency and have the power and resources to make a difference.



Individual accountability is almost useless when the majority of emissions and pollution are caused by corporations.

US Senator James Inhofe, who served as chair of the U.S. Senate Committee on Environment and Public Works, repeatedly called climate change a "hoax."

Investigations have shown that companies like Exxon have known about climate change as early as the 1970s but chose to downplay the severity of it.
